

Vietnamese war-baby, Dom Golding, was adopted into an Australian family in Mount Gambier. In 1999, he returned to Vietnam for his own tour of duty. Shrimp is a theatrical autobiography taking us to the streets of war torn Saigon, the wet pastures of Mount Gambier and the varied landscapes of modern Vietnam. Reflecting upon his rural upbringing and the chaos of Saigon, Dominic tries to reconcile his battle over footy, fish sauce and looking for his family.

Dominic Golding studied Drama, Acting and Directing at Flinders University. Since moving to Melbourne 6 years ago, he has worked with Australian Vietnamese Youth Media on Viet Boys (La Mama) and directed Walking Without Feet, a community development project with Vietnamese young adults with special needs, as well as various other projects.

Peta Hanrahan's main focus in theatre is style, form and the actor's journey; studying theatre as a fine art form through its humanity and technique. Peta studied with Le Coque Master, Richard Hayze Marshall from 1984 to 1987. Since then she has worked as a director, dramaturg, animateur, actor, puppeteer, lighting and set designer and stage manager and is currently on the Artistic Advisory Committee at Melbourne Worker's Theatre.
